This experience is considered both a time for learning as well as a chance to socialise. These two have many common points, but there are also aspects that differ one from the other.</p> <p>Even though, nowadays there is a fast-growing need for a stronger interoperability of military forces, not only with regard to the pure technical and procedural aspects but also to the ability for the European military officers to work closely and effectively together in order to prevent any eventual wars or natural disasters.</p> <p>Some academics have speculated that former Erasmus students will prove to be a powerful force in creating a pan-European identity. The political scientist Stefan Wolff, for example, has argued that "Give it 15, 20 or 25 years, and Europe will be run by leaders with a completely different socialisation from those of today", referring to the so-called 'Erasmus generation'</p>

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
