Encountered in the social, violent offenses committed are material actions that are outward manifestations of the individual expressing his attitude to social values, being punishable by criminal law. Elements of the concept do not differ from elements of the offense, as defined in criminal law, meaning that any act committed with typical human guilt, aimed on the person with its essential attributes, falls within the scope of crimes subject to our approach. Offenses committed with violence are illegal acts involving the use of coercion or the threat of hostilities in order to produce moral or material prejudice or personal integrity of the individual (murder, rape, beatings, injuries etc.) or its property (robbery, destruction, etc.).
