

The Deep-Web refers to a class of content that is on the internet, but not indexed on the search engines for technical reasons. The information on the Deep Web includes content from the intranet private networks (intern network of corporations, governmental agencies or universities) or commercial databases such as Lexis Nexisor Westlaw. Navigating deeper through the web, Dark Web is Deep Web segment which is intentionally hidden.
