Content description:

This article presents the main institutions of the Public Ministry and those of the Ministry of Interior which fight against serious crime. This criminal phenomenon is one with serious implications both for citizens and for national security. For these reasons it was decided to create within the Ministry of Interior in the first phase, directly subordinated to the General Inspectorate of Romanian Police, the General Directorate for Fighting against Organised Crime (D.C.C.O), subordinated to the General Inspectorate of the Border Police, the Directorate for Fighting against Illegal Migration and Transnational Crime and within the Public Ministry, the Directorate for Investigating Organized Crime and Terrorism (D.I.I.C.O.T.). The latter was created to harness the efforts of the first institution in the fight against serious crime, under the criminal prosecution line.
